




The population of Audenshaw is just bigger than the Tameside average of 11,796 people. 63.3% of this population is between the ages of 16 and 64 years old, which is more than the borough average of 62%.

Since 2013, All three of the wider age bands have increased in size, most notably the under 16 group, which has grown by 249 people.

The white population of Audenshaw is 93.7%, which is higher than the Tameside average of 91%; the Pakistani population equals the average value of 2%.



49.1% of GCSE students in Audenshaw achieve grades 5 and above in their English and Maths qualifications, which is significantly greater than the Tameside average of 40.8%.

The ward does, however, have a lower-than-average school readiness percentage, with Tameside's average value being 66%.

17.5% of residents have no qualifications, which is below the Tameside average of 19%. Those with level 4 qualifications or above make up 20.3% of the population; the Tameside average value for this is 20%, making Audenshaw slightly above average in this respect.



This map shows the deprivation rankings of the LSOAs (small areas of around 1500 people) which make up the ward. Those in decile 1 are within the top 10% deprived LSOAs in the country.

Audenshaw is less deprived than the Tameside average; the IMD deprivation score for Audenshaw is 21.3, which is lower than the borough's average score of 28.8.

The proportion of children living in poverty in the ward, 22.0%, is 7.5% below the Tameside average.

On average, 70% of adults in Tameside are employed, so Audenshaw's employment rate of 74.5% is above average for the borough. 8.6% of residents are self-employed, which exceeds the borough average of 8.0%.



The majority of properties in Audenshaw are owner occupied, with average market sale prices slightly below the Tameside average of £139,412. The percentage of private rented homes in Audenshaw is lower than the Tameside average of 14.2%.

8.3% of households are in fuel poverty, which is below the average of 10.2%, however there are an above average number of homes without central heating installed; the Tameside average central heating installation percentage is 97.3%.

51.7% of the residences in Audenshaw are semi-detached houses or bungalows, which is much more than the Tameside average value of 37.5%.







Hot Food Takeaways and Licenced Premises per 1000 People



Audenshaw has more hot food takeaways and licenced premises per 1000 people than the Tameside average, four times as many in the case of hot food takeaways, but has lower-than-average travel times to the nearest GP's surgery both with and without the use of a car.

There are four GP's surgeries in the ward, all of which have been rated as good or outstanding by the Care Quality Commission, which monitors healthcare practices nationally.

Audenshaw contains one pharmacy. The area, like all of Tameside, has sufficient pharmacy access.





Hospital Admission Rates per 100,000 people

Audenshaw has above average hospital admission rates for children under five years old, but below average admission rates for self-harm, alcohol related harm, and COPD. The prevalence of childhood obesity in reception class children is slightly higher than the Tameside average, with the gap widening slightly for year six students.

The biggest cause of death in Audenshaw is cancer, which is responsible for one in four of all deaths in the ward.

The male healthy life expectancy is slightly higher than the Tameside average of 58.1 years, while the female healthy life expectancy is below the average value of 57.6 years old.







The total crime rate in Audenshaw is below the Tameside average of 207.7 offences per 1000 people. Audenshaw has a lower rate of antisocial behaviour offences than the Tameside average, and also has a significantly smaller rate of domestic abuse per 1000 people. Although the rate of domestic abuse is much lower than average, it remains the third most committed crime in the ward.

Audenshaw has a lower-than-average rate of theft offences reported to the police compared to Tameside as a whole, yet theft is the most committed crime in the area
